Sub: Medical Insurance Scheme for Retirees – Non-inclusion of Resignees/Compulsorily Retired Employees for being eligible for Insurance Cover

We draw your kind attention to Circular Letter No.CO:HRD: :2015 20th November, 2015 addressed to all Branches/Regional Offices/Field General Manager's Offices conveying detailed guidelines on the above scheme. In particular, we draw your pointed reference to the following instructions:

“For the benefit of all concerned, it is once again clarified that **the Medical Insurance Scheme for retired officers/ employees will cover all officers/ employees who have retired on superannuation and voluntarily retired under the Bank's Pension Rules/OSR and under VRS 2001. The scheme will also cover the spouses of the retired employees as dependents.**”

In the light of your above instructions, Resignees and those employees who were Compulsorily Retired would not be eligible for Insurance cover under the above scheme. We reliably understand that the applications submitted by the Resignees and those Compulsorily Retired have not been considered by you and the premium amount has also not been debited to their respective accounts.

While on the subject, we draw your kind attention to the contents of Master Policy No. 500100/48/15/41/00000522 issued by United India Insurance Company Limited in respect of the above scheme. It is mentioned that Retired/Resigned Employees and/or their Widow/Widower of Union Bank as per schedule attached have been insured. **We have also gathered from reliable sources that the Insurance Company is not against inclusion of the above category of employees for being covered under this scheme. Many other Public Sector**

Banks like Indian Bank have included the Resignees and Compulsorily Retired employees for being covered under this scheme.

Therefore, non-consideration of the applications submitted by the Resignees /Compulsorily Retired employees is not correct. Since the Policy mentions "Retired" which includes those Compulsorily Retired, we request you to kindly arrange to include the names of all the Resignees and Compulsorily Retired employees for being eligible for Insurance cover under the above scheme.

Further, we are also advising all the Resignees and Compulsorily Retired, who had not so far submitted the application under this scheme to do so immediately so that their applications may also be included under the Master Policy of United India Insurance Company Limited. We are aware that the scheme is open till 31st January, 2016. We request you to kindly issue suitable instructions to all Branches/Offices so that all the employees who had resigned or Compulsorily Retired are informed of these fresh instructions immediately so that they may be in a position to submit the applications well before the stipulated date i.e. 31st January, 2016 for joining the above scheme.

We look forward to your favourable instructions.
